BY-LAWS FOR THE OHIO PAINT HORSE CLUB, INC.

Article I

Name, Purpose, Location and Corporate Seal

Section 1. Name.

This organization shall be named the Ohio Paint Horse Club, Inc. It is a non-profit corporation, FEIN 31-1043951. The official abbreviation shall be OPHC. All further references in this document made to the name of this club shall be referred to as Club.

Section 2. Purpose.

The Club shall at all times be operated and conducted as a non-profit corporation in accordance with the laws of the state Ohio. The purposes of the Club are as follows:

- A. To create, stimulate and promote interest in the breeding, riding and showing of the Paint Horse in the State of Ohio;
- B. To at all times promote the upgrading of the Paint Horse;
- C. To improve the breed in this State;
- D. To promote and hold horse shows, participate in horse shows, hold trail rides and clinics, and other activities;
- E. To promote and create interest in the Paint Horse and to do any and all things necessary or incident to the accomplishment of such purposes.

Section 3. Location.

- A. The Club shall include the following area: Boundary shall include the State of Ohio and all official eighty-eight (88) counties, but its members may be residents of any state.
- B. A map of the official boundaries of the Club is included with these by-laws. Please reference the map below:



Section 4. Place of Business.

The principal office of the Club shall be the address of the duly elected secretary, but business of the Club may be conducted at any location established by the Board of Trustees.

Article II
Members

Section 1. Membership.

- A. Any person having a bona fide interest in Paint Horses may apply for membership.
- B. The following types of memberships are available: Individual, Youth, Family, and Organizational and shall be in accordance with the rules and regulations as adopted by the Board of Trustees. Please see the OPHC Rules and Regulations for detailed information regarding membership.
- C. Memberships expire December 31 of each year.

Section 2. Rights.

- A. All members shall have equal rights, interest and responsibility with respect to the club and its property. There shall be no shares of stock issued to any member. In all matters governed by the vote of the members, each member in good standing shall be entitled to vote(s) as established by the Board of Trustees.
- B. Number of votes per membership type are as follows:
 1. Individual: Shall be entitled to one vote and is eligible to serve as a Trustee.
 2. Youth: Shall not be entitled to vote or serve as a Trustee.
 3. Family: Shall be entitled to up to two votes, one for each adult parent. Must list names of parents on membership registration for voting privileges Adults parent/s may serve as a Trustee
 4. Organizational: Shall be entitled to one vote and is eligible to serve as a Trustee.

Section 3. Meetings.

- A. Annual Membership Meeting. The annual meeting of the membership of this corporation shall be held prior to January 1st of the following year at such place as agreed upon by a majority of the Board of Trustees, with a minimum of one meeting per year. Officers and directors are voted on at this meeting.
- B. Special Meetings. Special meetings of the general membership may be called by a notice signed by not less than ten percent of the adult members; adult to be individual, family or organizational member, then in good standing. Notice of special meeting indicating briefly the subject or object thereof shall be given in the same manner as provided below with respect to notice of meetings.
- C. Notice of Meetings: Notice of annual, special, and other meetings shall be given to the members by the Secretary by posting on OPHC Website and/or other public media thirty days before such meeting.
- D. Email or telephone voting is permitted if called by the President and determined to be of an urgent nature.
- E. Order of Business. Robert's Rules of Order shall prevail at all meetings:
 1. Call to Order
 2. Roll Call of Membership
 3. Election of Officers and Directors
 4. Reading of Minutes of Previous Meeting
 5. Treasurer's Report
 6. Communications and Notices
 7. Reading of Reports and Statements
 8. Unfinished Business
 9. New or Miscellaneous Business
 10. Adjournment
- F. Quorum: Fifty percent plus one of the members of the Club shall constitute a quorum for the purpose of business at a membership meeting. Except as provided elsewhere in the by-laws, a simple majority vote of the members present at any meeting of the membership shall be sufficient to approve any matter brought before the membership for action. No business shall be conducted without a quorum being present, with the exception of adjourning the meeting until a quorum shall be present. Absentee or vote by proxy will not be allowed at any annual or special membership meeting.

Article III
Board of Trustees

Section 1. Board of Trustees.

- A. The Board of Trustees shall consist of eleven persons:
 1. Four Officers of the Club which includes a President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer.
 2. Six Directors
 3. One Past President is retained as a Director with voting rights until their successor goes out of office.
- B. All six Directors, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer and Past President shall have equal votes. The President shall cast a ballot in case of a tie vote.
- C. Each Trustee shall be a bona fide resident of the area.
- D. No more than two members of any family or firm may sit on the Board of Trustees.
- E. Persons elected to the Board of Trustees shall pay their dues before taking office.
- F. No member shall hold office without being at least nineteen years of age as of January 1 of the year of election.

- G. Members serving on the Board of Trustees, Committee Chair and as National Directors representing the Club must be a member of the APHA and OPHC.
- H. The Board of Trustees is the governing body of the club.
- I. Any Officer or Director missing three (3) consecutive meetings will be relieved of their office by the Board of Trustees. Phone or video conference call attendance shall count as attendance in lieu of physical attendance.

Section 2. Power and authority of the Board.

The business and property of the Club shall be controlled and managed by the Board of Trustees. The Board of Trustees shall have the power and authority to adopt, amend, repeal and enforce such rules and regulations, (not contrary to the laws of the State, the Certificate of Incorporation, or these by-laws) as they may deem expedient concerning the:

- A. Conduct, management and activities of the Club;
- B. Removal or suspension of officers and directors;
- C. Admission, classification, qualification, suspension and expulsion of members;
- D. Fixing and collecting of dues and fees;
- E. Expenditure of monies;
- F. Auditing of books and records;
- G. Awarding of year-end awards and recognition;
- H. Conducting of shows, contests, exhibitions, races, sales and social functions and other details relating to the general purposes of the Club; and
- I. Establishing standing and/or special committees.
- J. Standing Committees:
 - 1. The President shall appoint standing committees as needed. All committee members must be a member of APHA and OPHC.
- K. Marketing of the Club and activities.

Section 3. Vacancies.

Any elected open office in the Club created by any reason will be filled by an appointment by the President until it can be filled by election at the next General Membership Meeting for the unexpired term of that office.

Section 4. Records.

Records and materials compiled and maintained pursuant to the completion of OPHC business are the property of the OPHC. This includes, but is not limited to, the records of officers, committee chairperson, futurity chairperson, point keeper, membership secretary, awards and donations. Upon the completion of his/her tenure, each guardian will be required to surrender the records to the OPHC President or his/her designee. Records should be maintained for a period not less than 5 years.

Section 5. Board of Trustee Meetings.

- A. Yearly Meetings. There shall be a minimum of six (6) meetings of the Trustees per year with the time and/or place to be determined by the President. Trustees are permitted to attend the meetings in person or via phone and/or video conference call.
- B. Special Meetings. Special Meetings of the Board of Trustee may be called by President, Vice President or by a majority of members of Board of Trustees. Notify by ten days before meeting.
- C. Notice of Meetings. Notice of annual, special and other meetings shall be given to the members by the Secretary by posting on OPHC Website and/or other public media thirty days before such meeting. Notice for special meetings of the Trustees is ten days prior.
- D. The general membership may attend Board meetings as guests, but not participants. Exception: Executive sessions may be held as closed meetings. See *Roberts' Rules of Order* for definition of "Executive Session". Actions of the Board are subject to ratification by the membership at the annual membership meeting.
- E. Email or telephone voting is permitted if called by the President and determined to be of an urgent nature.
- F. Order of Business. Robert's Rules of Order shall prevail at all meetings:
 - 1. Call to Order
 - 2. Roll Call of Membership
 - 3. Election of Officers and Directors
 - 4. Reading of Minutes of Previous Meeting
 - 5. Treasurer's Report
 - 6. Communications and Notices
 - 7. Reading of Reports and Statements
 - 8. Unfinished Business
 - 9. New or Miscellaneous Business
 - 10. Adjournment
- G. Quorum: Fifty percent plus one of the members of the Board shall constitute a quorum for the purpose of business at a Board of Trustees meeting. Except as provided elsewhere in the by-laws, a simple majority vote of the Trustees present at any meeting of the Board shall be sufficient to approve any matter brought before the Board for action. No business shall be conducted without a quorum being present, with the exception of adjourning the meeting until a quorum shall be present. Absentee or vote by

proxy will not be allowed at any Board of Trustee meeting.

Article IV Officers and Duties

Section 1. Officers

The officers of the club shall be the President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer and such other Officers as may be authorized by the Board of Directors.

Section 2. Duties.

- A. President: The President shall perform all duties incident to such office, preside at all meetings and perform such other and further duties as may, from time to time, be required of the President by the Directors, cast ballot in case of tie vote and appoint special committees.
- B. Vice President: The Vice President shall perform all duties of the President in case of the latter's absence or disability.
- C. Secretary: The Secretary shall keep an accurate record of all transactions of the Members and Trustees and shall give all notices required by law and Code of Regulations or By-Laws of the Club. The Secretary shall keep a proper book and records of the club affairs and at the expiration of the term of Office shall deliver all books, papers and property of the Club to the President or their successor. The Secretary shall forward information to the web master as appropriate for posting on the website. The yearly election results of the OPHC must be forwarded to APHA on or before the current due date.
- D. Treasurer: To receive and safely keep all monies and securities of the Club and to keep account and records of the finances which shall be open to inspection by Club members at all times and to perform all other duties incident thereto. All expenditures exceeding \$300.00, except for actual horse show expenses, shall be approved by the Trustees in a meeting before payment is ordered. The Treasurer of the Club will be bonded for the mutual protection of the Club and Treasurer. The Treasurer shall prepare a complete financial statement to be presented to the membership at the Annual Meeting. The Club Treasurer will be responsible for having tax returns prepared and filed. A complete yearly financial report of the OPHC must be forwarded to APHA on or before the current due date.

Article V Election of Officers and Directors

Section 1. Nomination.

- A. The President shall appoint a nominating committee at least sixty (60) days prior to the Annual Meeting of the election of officers.
- B. Additional nominees can be accepted from the floor at the annual membership meeting.
- C. Any person can be nominated who is a member in good standing of the OPHC at least (60) days before and must have previously consented to such nomination.
- D. Membership closes sixty (60) days before the election.

Section 2. Election.

- A. The election of officers and directors will be conducted at the annual membership meeting. Voting by proxy or assigning one's vote to another person to vote in his absence is NOT allowed. Only adult members in good standing will be permitted to vote.
- B. All voting for Officers and Directors shall be by written/voice ballot.
 1. (*Written/Voice Ballot at a Meeting*) Ballots with the slate of nominees are handed out or presented to the members in good standing at the annual membership meeting. Elections shall begin with the President. Each Officer and Director shall be nominated, voted upon and election completed before nomination can be accepted for the next office, so that nominees not elected for a position may be nominated for subsequent office and/or director positions. Members must be in attendance and nominations from the floor can be accepted. Absentee voting is not allowed.
- C. The nominee receiving a simple majority of votes shall be elected. An Officer or Director may also be elected by acclamation if there are no others running for that position.
- D. Results of the election shall be forwarded to the APHA office by their current deadline. Current deadline to submit election results to APHA is by March 1 of each year.

Section 3. Term of Office.

- A. The Officers of the Club shall serve for a term one (1) year
- B. The Directors of the Club shall serve for a term of two (2) years. The terms of the Directors are staggered into two groups of three: three Director positions expire each year; the other three Director positions expire the following year. Therefore, at each yearly election, three expired Director position are voted on.
- C. Officers and Directors will take office immediately following the General Membership Meeting.

Article VI Amendments

The Board of Trustees shall have the power and authority to make, amend, repeal and enforce such rules and regulations, not contrary to law or the Certificate of Incorporation or these By-Laws, as they may deem necessary with expedience concerning the conduct, management, and

activities of the Club, the admission, classification, qualification, suspension and expulsion and removal of money, the auditing of books and records, the conducting of shows, contests, exhibitions, races, sales and social functions and other details relating to the general purposes of the club, all however, subject to revision or amendment by the members, provided written notice of intention by any member to move the revision or specified amendment of any rule or regulation shall have been mailed to the President by sixty days prior to the annual meeting. These regulations may be amended, supplemented or repealed by written assent thereto at any Trustees monthly meeting provided all Trustees have been notified in writing of such desire to amend said regulation. Three fourths (3/4) of the Trustees must be present at said meeting with two thirds (2/3) majority vote to change said regulations. Any member in good standing may propose an amendment to the By-Laws by submitting the proposed amendment in writing to the executive committee through the business office. The amendment will become effective only upon written ballot by the Board of Directors. The OPHC Board reserves the right to interpret, amend and enforce all rules. Any decision or interpretation made by the Board shall be final.

Article VII **Indemnification**

Each Director, Officer and Committee person of said Club shall be indemnified by the Club against all cost, expense, and liabilities reasonably incurred by him/her in connection with/or resulting from any action, suit or proceeding to which he/she may be made a party by reason of his/her being or having been a Director, Officer or Committee person of the Club, except in relation to matters which shall have been occasioned by the willful misconduct or dishonesty of such Officer, Director or Committee person. The foregoing right of indemnification shall cover amounts paid in settlement of any such action, suit or proceeding when such settlement appears to be in the best interest of the Club. The foregoing right shall be in addition to any other right to which such Director, Officer or Committee person may be entitled as a matter of law.

Article VIII **Dissolution**

Upon dissolution of the corporation, the Board of Directors shall, after paying or making provision for the payment of all the liabilities of the corporation, dispose of all the assets of the corporation exclusively for the purposes of the corporation in such manner, or to such organizations or organizations organized and operated exclusively for agricultural purposes as shall at the time qualify as exempt organization or organizations under Section 501.C(5) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, or the corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal Revenue Law, the Board of Directors shall determine. The American Paint Horse Association, Fort Worth, Texas, is to be given first consideration.

Article IX **Suspension and Expulsion of Members**

Any member may be suspended or expelled by the Trustees for failure to pay dues or for conduct unbecoming a member. Before any member is suspended or expelled, written notice of the charges against him/her and the time and place of the meeting of the Trustees at which the same are to be considered, shall be mailed to him/her at their address as it appears in the record of the corporation, at least thirty (30) days before such meeting; and he/she shall be given an opportunity to defend, and shall have the right to appeal from the decision of the Trustees to the members, and upon their written request the Secretary shall call a special meeting of the members to consider such appeal. National suspension carries Ohio Paint Horse Club suspension automatically. A member in good standing is one who is free of disciplinary restrictions.

Article X **Liability**

The OPHC and co-sponsoring organizations, if any, shall not be responsible for any personal injury, or for loss or damage to property, occurring at any OPHC activity. Each owner, exhibitor, handler, or consignor shall indemnify and hold harmless the OPHC, its officers, directors, and employees from and against all claims, demands, causes of action, and expenses of every kind, including attorney's fees, arising out of or related in any manner to the acts or omissions of an owner, exhibitor, handler or consignor or the actions of any animal under the card, custody, or control of the owner, exhibitor, handler or consignor. Presentation of signed entry or consignment forms shall be deemed acceptance of the conditions of this rule. In the event an entry or consignment form is not signed or presented, appearance on the grounds or at the sale ring of any OPHC activity as an exhibitor, handler, owner or consignor shall be deemed to be acceptance of the conditions of this rule.

Article XI **Affiliated Clubs**

All affiliated OPHC Clubs, i.e. OPHC Youth Club and OPHC Amateur Club, must submit minutes and attendance of all meetings to the OPHC Secretary. A financial statement must be submitted on a quarterly basis or upon request of the OPHC Directors. All affiliated OPHC Club bank accounts shall have the OPHC Treasurer as a signor on the account.

**Article XII
In Case of Conflict**

In any conflict or omission of the rules of the OPHC Bylaws, rules will revert to the American Paint Horse Association current rule book.

OPHC Committee Chair Descriptions

Awards Banquet- To make arrangements for the OPHC annual awards banquet at a facility with ample space for meetings, stallion service auction, and awards banquet.

Awards & Points- Determine award winners and notify such for preference of awards if offering more than one option. Shop for and purchase awards. Expenditures must be approved by the Board of Directors. Present or designate someone to present awards at the awards banquet. Track all OPHC points earned by members throughout each show year.

Club Reporter- To report on club activities.

Marketing- The purpose of this chair is to promote awareness of the OPHC for members and prospective members. This can include utilizing the following measures: Communication and outreach to current and potential members at events; Create and post relevant social media content for regular social media presence; Maintain up to date content on the website, and ensure proper site functioning; Curate and send out monthly newsletters and/or emails to members; Collaborate with the Board of Trustees to broadly advertise upcoming events; Take and post pictures at OPHC events, and encourage members to share as well, for regular addition to social media and website; Conduct demographic research in an effort to collect data concerning wants, needs, and desires of members.

Membership- To collect OPHC memberships, forward all money collected to the OPHC treasurer, compile a membership list to be furnished to the OPHC secretary, points chair, awards chair, and newsletter editor, and to periodically notify each of any new members.

Recreational Riding- To organize and schedule club sponsored trail rides. To ensure that all participants sign a liability release waiver to be forwarded to the OPHC treasurer, and that all OPHC rules and APHA rules governing recreational trail riding be followed.

Ride Ohio- To coordinate the Ride Ohio program, compile time logs and forward time logs to the awards chair for inclusion in the awards booklet.

Solid Paint Bred Representative- Focus on building opportunities for members to utilize their Solid Paint Bred (SPB) horses at events such as shows, trail rides, and other OPHC events.

Stallion Service Auction (SSA) & Futurity- Manage all aspects of the Stallion Service Auction, including contacting and contracting stallion owners, advertising (advertising costs exceeding \$300.00 to be approved by the Board of Trustees). To submit auction information to the newsletter editor, and OPHC secretary for the website. Collect SSA Futurity entries and entry money, forward money to OPHC treasurer. Ensure eligibility, coordinate and assist with classes at the show. Help to determine payouts to exhibitors, shop for and purchase awards. Expenditures must be approved by the Board of Directors.

OPHC Halter & Performance Stakes- To collect entries, ensure futurity rules are followed, forward money collected to the OPHC treasurer. To organize the futurity class at the show and to coordinate payouts to the exhibitors.

Youth Club Advisor- To advise the youth club in all youth club matters, assist with the youth club show, coordinate youth club meetings, and assist with the youth club year-end awards. To be the contact person between the youth club and the board of directors.

Youth Scholarship- To collect scholarship applications, determine applicant eligibility, submit scholarship applications to selection committee. Present scholarships at the awards banquet or designate someone to present them.

OHIO PAINT HORSE YOUTH CLUB BY-LAWS

PURPOSE: To create, stimulate and promote interest in the breeding, riding and showing of the Paint Horse for the Youth of the State of Ohio. To, at all times, promote the upgrading of the Paint Horse to improve the breed in this State. To promote and hold horse shows, participate in horse shows, hold trail rides and other activities, to promote and create interest with the Youth towards the Paint Horse and to do any and all things necessary or incident to the accomplishment of such purposes.

CODE OF REGULATIONS

1. MEETINGS

- A. GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETINGS: Meetings of the organization shall be held at such time and place as agreed upon by a majority of the members. Notice of the same shall be sent to all members by the Secretary.
- B. EXECUTIVE MEETINGS: Meetings of the Officers shall be held at the discretion of the President or Vice President.
- C. NOTICE OF MEETINGS: Notice of special and monthly meetings shall be given to the members by the Secretary either my mail or telephone, whichever is appropriate at least ten (10) days before such meetings.
- D. SPECIAL MEETINGS: Special meetings may be called by the President, Vice President, Youth Advisor or by a majority of the members.

2. MEMBERSHIP AND DUES: Any youth eighteen (18) years of age and under, having a bona fide interest in Paint Horses may apply for membership. Any youth who pays membership dues to the Ohio Paint Horse Club will automatically become a member of the Ohio Paint Horse Youth Club.

3. OFFICERS

- A. The Officers of the Club shall consist of a President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer to be elected by a majority vote of the members present at the last General Membership Meeting or a meeting designated by the club advisor, of each calendar year for a term of one (1) year.
- B. Youth Club Advisor is subject to approval by the Directors of the Ohio Paint Horse Club.

4. DUTIES OF THE OFFICERS

- A. PRESIDENT: The President shall perform all duties incident to such office, preside at all meetings, and perform such other and further duties as may from time to time arise, cast ballot in case of tie vote and appoint special committees.
- B. VICE PRESIDENT: The Vice President shall perform all the duties of the President in case of the President's absence or disability.
- C. SECRETARY: The Secretary shall keep an accurate record of all transactions of the members and shall give all notices required by law and Code of Regulations or By-Laws of the Club. They shall keep a proper book and record of membership and at the expiration of his/her term of office shall deliver all books, papers and property of the Club to the President or their successor. The Secretary should send a copy of all approved minutes to the OPHC Secretary and President.
- D. TREASURER: The Treasurer shall receive and safely keep all monies and securities of the Club and to keep account and records of the finances which shall be open to inspection by club members at all times and to perform all other duties incident thereto. The Treasurer shall submit quarterly reports and yearly reports to the membership and OPHC Treasurer, and submit the financial records to the OPHC Treasurer for an annual audit. The OPHC Treasurer shall receive the bank statements from the bank and a copy forwarded to the Youth Treasurer. All expenditures exceeding \$150.00 for the actual running expenses of the Club shall be approved by the OPHC Board of Directors before payment is ordered. An exception shall be the expenses incurred for the Youth Club sponsored horse show(s) and Year End Awards which the Club sponsors. These expenses may be paid without approval of the OPHC as long as they are kept within the figure of the previous year.

5. ELECTION: All voting for Officers shall be by ballot. Nominations may be made by a nominating committee or by nomination from the floor. Any person nominated must have previously consented to such nomination. Each officer shall be nominated, voted upon and election completed before nominations can be accepted for the next office.

Before any member is suspended or expelled, written notice of the charges against him/her and of the time and place of the meeting of the membership at which the same are to be considered, shall be mailed to him/her at his/her address as it appears in the records of the corporation, at least thirty (30) days prior to such meeting. He/she shall be given an opportunity to defend and shall have the right to appeal from the decision of the membership and upon his/her written request the Secretary shall call a special meeting of the members to consider such appeal.

8. AMENDMENTS: These regulations may be amended, supplemented or repealed by the written assent thereto at any membership meeting provided all members have been notified of such desire to amend said regulations.

PURPOSE: To create, stimulate, and promote interest in the breeding, riding and showing of the Paint Horse for the Amateurs of the State of Ohio. To, at all times, promote the upgrading of the Paint Horse to improve the breed in the State. To promote and hold horse shows, participate in horse shows, hold trail rides and other activities, to promote and create interest with the Amateurs towards the Paint Horse and to do any and all things necessary or incidental to the accomplishment of such purposes.

CODE OF REGULATIONS

1. MEETINGS
 - A. GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING: Meetings of this organization shall be held at such time and place as agreed upon by a majority of the members. Notice of the same shall be sent to all members by the OPHC Newsletter. A minimum of four meetings shall be held each year.
 - B. EXECUTIVE MEETINGS: Meetings of the Officers shall be held at the discretion of the President and Vice President.
 - C. SPECIAL MEETINGS: Special meetings may be called by the President, Vice President or by a majority of the members.
2. MEMBERSHIP AND DUES
 - A. Any Amateur who pays membership dues to the Ohio Paint Horse Club, and who is over eighteen (18) years old and having a bona fide interest in the Paint Horse will automatically become a member of the Ohio Paint Horse Amateur Club.
 - B. Amateurs MUST hold an APHA Amateur and/or Novice Amateur card for the current year to be eligible for OPHAC membership.
3. OFFICERS: The Officers of this Club shall consist of a President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer to be elected by a majority vote of the members present at the last General Membership Meeting or as designated by the president of each calendar year for a term of one (1) year. The Past President will be retained as an Officer until their successor goes out of office. Officers must be OPHC members.
4. DUTIES OF THE OFFICERS
 - A. PRESIDENT: The President shall perform all duties incident to such office, preside at all meetings, and perform such duties when the time arises, cast ballot in case of tie vote and appoint special committees.
 - B. VICE PRESIDENT: The Vice President shall perform all the duties of the President in case of the latter's absence or disability.
 - C. SECRETARY: The Secretary shall keep an accurate record of all transactions of the members and shall give all notices required by law and Code of Regulations or By-Laws of the Club. The Secretary shall keep a proper book and record of membership and at the expiration of his/her term of office shall deliver all books, paper and property of the Club to the President or their successor. Secretary should send a copy of all approved minutes to the OPHC Secretary and President.
 - D. The Treasurer shall submit quarterly reports and yearly reports to the membership and OPHC Treasurer, and submit the financial records to the OPHC Treasurer for an annual audit. The OPHC Treasurer shall receive the bank statements from the bank and a copy forwarded to the Amateur Treasurer.
5. ELECTION: All voting for officers shall be by ballot. Nominations may be made by nominating committee or by nominations from the floor. Any person nominated must hold an APHA amateur card and have previously consented to such nomination. Each officer shall be nominated, voted upon and election completed before nominations can be accepted for the next office.

OHIO PAINT HORSE CLUB AWARDS SYSTEM

1. In order to be eligible to receive points and awards in the OPHC, the/all owner(s) must hold membership in the OPHC. In addition, the exhibitor of the horse must also hold membership in the OPHC. The owner is the person(s) or organization(s) whose name last appears on the horse's registration papers. In the case of an organization, it must also be a member of the OPHC for the horse to be eligible for points, even if some or all of the members of the organization may individually be members of the OPHC. In order to receive state points and awards, paid OPHC membership must be received prior to showing in any class. (Points earned prior to payment of dues will not accumulate in total year-end points.) The winner of any award must be a member in good standing at the end of the point year.
2. A \$50.00 fee will be charged for each non-sufficient funds (NSF) check. Notice of NSF check will be sent to the member via certified mail from the treasure. Checks must be re-paid with certified funds within 30 days. If said check is not repaid within 30 days after certified notification has been sent, another certified letter will be sent warning further legal action. If said check is not paid after final notice information will then be turned over to the proper authorities for collection. The individual will be on a cash only basis until further notice as decided by the OPHC Board.
3. No Ohio points will be awarded for the show for which the NSF check was written or fees not paid. Points will begin accruing only from the date that back funds are paid.
4. For every OPHC show, a signed check or \$100 cash deposit must be left at the show office or entry fees must be paid in full at the time of entry. IF YOU DO NOT PAY ENTRY FEES AT THE SHOW IN FULL OR IF YOU LEAVE A NSF CHECK, YOU WILL NOT RECEIVE OHIO POINTS.
5. Any and all shows in the state of Ohio approved by the APHA and sponsored by the OPHC (including Youth and Amateur clubs) will be approved for OPHC points. In order for shows sponsored by organizations other than those affiliated with OPHC to be approved for OPHC points, an OPHC Show Approval form must be completed, signed and submitted with a complete show bill and a \$50 application fee, 90 (ninety) days or March 1 (whichever is earlier) of the calendar year prior to the proposed show date, requesting their show be approved for state points. A membership in the OPHC must be held in the name of the person or organization that is making the application. The bottom of the show bill shall state: "The Ohio Paint Horse Club, Inc., its officers and directors will not be responsible for loss, injury, or theft of any kind at this particular function". Show sponsors must provide the following to the OPHC point secretary within 10 days following the show: 1) show results which will include APHA show roster and copies of each judge's cards for each class offered, 2) copies of emails or correspondence from APHA regarding any corrections to the show. Any OPHC memberships (forms and fees) taken at the show must be forwarded to the membership chairperson within 10 (ten) days. It is the show committee's responsibility to have forms available. Show committee must permit OPHC exhibitors to use OPHC back numbers in order to avoid duplication of numbers in the point system. Show sponsored by an outside organization must send a copy of their proof of insurance including the Liability Declarations page listing the complete name, address and the insured as listed on the show application. The OPHC requires Limits of Liability on Liability Declarations will be \$2,000,000, General Aggregate and \$1,000,000 each occurrence. An additional Certificate of Insured Endorsement in the same name of the show application naming the OPHC, Inc. as additionally insured is required within 30 days after the show approval.
6. The results of any approved show must be completed in their entirety on official forms furnished by the OPHC listing the first seven (7) horses, unless fewer than that number competed. These forms should be forwarded to the Point Secretary within ten (10) days after completion of the show.
7. To be eligible for OPHC Year End Awards in any class (i.e. Sr. Western Pleasure) the horse or horse/rider combination must show under ten (10) judges (of that same class- i.e. Sr. Western Pleasure) at OPHC approved shows, of which four (4) judges must be at non Paint-O-Rama shows, and of which one (1) of those shows must be held within the boundaries of Ohio.
8. All points are to be awarded on the placing based on the number of entries. Disqualified horses are to be counted as an entry in the class unless it is disqualified by the APHA Performance Department due to a violation of an eligibility rule set forth by the current APHA rule book. The system is as follows: For a class of six (6) or more horses in halter or performance, the first place horse receives six (6) points, the second place five (5) points, etc. The first place horse gets no more points than were in that class. The Grand Champion will receive two (2) more points than the largest

- class in their sex division. The Reserve Champion will receive one (1) more point than the largest class in their sex division. This is regardless of whether the Grand or Reserve were in the largest class. No OPHC approved show may award more than one set of points per judge.
9. The OPHC shall give an award to the Halter Horse accumulating the most halter points in each sex division.
 10. The OPHC shall give an award to the All Around Horse of the Year. To be eligible, a horse must have received at least ten (10) points in the Halter Division, at least ten (10) points in each of two (2) different performance categories (defined in the APHA rule book, rule SC-050). The number of Halter Points must match the number of Performance Points per category above the minimum. Amateur and Youth Points will not count in these Year End Awards.
 11. The OPHC shall give an award to the High Point Performance Horse. To be eligible, a horse must have received at least five (5) points in a minimum of four (4) different performance classes. The four (4) different performance classes are to be in a minimum of at least two (2) different categories (defined in the APHA rule book, rule SC-050). Amateur and Youth Points will not count in these Year End Awards. OPHC Board of Directors will vote on any new memorial rewards or retirement.
 12. The OPHC shall give an award to the Stallion, Mare and Gelding accumulating the most overall total points. Points will include halter and/or performance. Amateur and Youth Points will not count in these Year End Awards.
 13. Points shall not count in Futurity or Stakes Classes.
 14. Any member that has been suspended by APHA shall also be suspended from the OPHC (see Bylaws #11).
 15. All High Point Awards are to be of the same quality (monetary) for Champion. Reserve Awards are to be of the same quality (monetary) also. The All Around Horse and High Point Performance and High Point Overall Stallion, Mare and Gelding shall receive a more distinguishing award than the High Point Halter Horse.
 16. The OPHC shall give an award to the horse accumulating the most points in speed classes. To be eligible for this award the horse must have a minimum of ten (10) points in two (2) different speed events.
 17. For the rotating Memorial Awards, there will also be an engraved plaque given by the OPHC for the recipient to keep.
 18. Any special award(s) given out at the Awards Banquet by an individual or organization will not be given until all qualifications to win said award are published in the OPHC newsletter or OPHC rule book and the Board will not approve any special awards until these qualifications to win said awards are presented.
 19. Final Year-End points tabulations are to be audited by Committee at least once prior to the Awards Banquet designated by the President.
 20. The OPHC shall give a **Bob Snyder Memorial Award** to the regular registry horse earning the highest overall points in Open Halter for the year. The award must be returned to the Awards & Points Chairperson forty-five (45) days prior to the Awards Banquet or by December 1st of the year received, for engraving the following year's recipient. The return of this trophy will be the complete responsibility of the recipient.
 21. The OPHC shall give a **Glenn Bennett Memorial Award** to the year-end Overall Open High Point Regular Registry Halter Mare. The award must be returned to the Awards & Points Chairperson forty-five (45) days prior to the Awards Banquet or by December 1st of the year received, for engraving the following year's recipient. The return of this trophy will be the complete responsibility of the recipient.
 22. The OPHC Board reserves the right to interpret, amend and enforce all rules. Any decision or interpretation made by the Board shall be final.
 23. Weekend High Point and Circuit Awards will not require OPHC membership.
 24. The OPHC shall give a **Gilbert (Butch) Snider Memorial Award** to the High Point Open Trail Horse (Green class not included). The award must be returned to the Awards & Points Chairperson forty-five (45) days prior to the Awards Banquet or by December 1st of the year received, for engraving the following year's recipient. The return of this trophy will be the complete responsibility of the recipient.

PAC (Paint Alternative Competition) RECOGNITION

The Ohio Paint Horse Club (OPHC) will recognize the Regular Registry and/or Solid paint bred Paint Horses in competition outside of the approved APHA and OPHC shows as long as the event and/or class is recognized as an APHA—PAC event. OPHC will not keep record of credits earned, but will provide recognition of the horse that is highest in credits for the State of Ohio through APHA. See the APHA Rule Book for rules in the Paint Alternative Competition.

OPHC YOUTH AWARDS SYSTEM

1. The system of points shall be the same as the OPHC.
2. To qualify for youth points in the State of Ohio a horse must be owned or leased by the youth and/or youth's family (mother, father, brother, sister, aunt, uncle, legal guardian, or grandparent), family owned corporation, ranch or farm (APHA Rule YP-015). To qualify for OPHC youth points in Ohio when the horse does not meet ownership requirements, an APHA lease form must be on file with the OPHC Points & Awards Chairperson. A lease form must be obtained, completed, and given to the OPHC Points & Awards Chairperson before any points will be counted.
3. Points will go with the one horse/one rider combination except for Lead Line. No lease is needed and points will follow the rider, but an OPHC member must own the horse.
4. Points count for any youth classes held at an Ohio Paint Horse Club show or club approved show.
5. There will be a year end high point and reserve high point award given by OPHC in Walk –Trot (5-10), Novice Youth, 13 & under, 14-18, and Solid Paint Bred Youth 18& under years of age divisions.
6. OPHC will also award a grand and reserve in each youth class.
7. The rules for the Youth Team competition shall be determined at the November Membership meeting by the Youth Club Members.
8. There will be a High Point All Around Youth Trophy awarded. This is the **Carolyn Williams Memorial**. This award is given to the youth with the highest number of youth points. To qualify for this award the youth/horse combination must have 10 state youth halter points, plus 10 state youth performance points in each of three of the six categories as defined in APHA Rule YP-025. In case of a tie, the Youth with the most firsts, etc. shall receive this trophy. There will be an appropriate award given by OPHC that the recipient may keep as well as a rotating trophy that must be returned to the Awards & Points Chairperson forty-five (45) days prior to the Awards Banquet or by December 1st of the year received, for engraving the following year's recipient. The return of this trophy will be the complete responsibility of the recipient.
9. There will be a High Point Youth Showmanship Trophy awarded. This is the **JULIE SIMS MEMORIAL TROPHY**. This is awarded to the youth/horse combination accumulating the most pints in youth showmanship (13 & under or 14-18 youth showmanship classes). For a Walk-Trot (5-9) youth to be eligible for this award, they must show in the 13& under age division. In case of a tie, the youth with the most firsts, etc. shall be awarded the trophy. There will be an appropriate award given by OPHC that the recipient may keep as well as a rotation trophy that must be returned to the Points & Awards Chairperson forty-five (45) days prior to the awards banquet, or by December 1st of the year received, for engraving the following year's recipient. The return of this trophy will be the complete responsibility of the recipient.
10. Five awards will be presented to the top five (5) Youth by the OPHYC. These awards are given to the youth with the highest number of youth points (13 & under or 14-18 classes). To qualify for these awards a youth/horse must show under ten (10) judges at OPHC approved shows, of which four (4) judges must be at non-Paint-O-Rama shows. and of which one (1) of those shows must be held within the boundaries of Ohio.
11. An award will be presented to the Top 2 all around Walk-Trot horse/rider by OPHYC. These awards are to be given to the Youth with the highest combined number of points in Walk-Trot and Youth Halter classes. To qualify for these awards, the youth/horse combination must show under ten (10) judges of which four (4) judges must be at non-Paint-O-Rama shows, and of which one (1) of those shows must be held within the boundaries of Ohio.
12. An award will be presented to the High Point Youth Performance Horse by OPHYC. This award is given to the Youth horse combination that has accumulated the most youth state performance points (13 & under or 14-18 classes). To qualify for this award a youth/horse combination must compete in two (2) classes in three (3) of the six (6) categories, as defined in APHA Rule YP-025 and must also have at least five (5) state points in each class for a total of ten (10)

state points in the category.

13. A sportsmanship award will be awarded in each age division: Walk-Trot (5-10), 13& under and 14-18. This award is determined by popular vote of the members of the OPHC Youth Club. This is a rotating award and must be returned to the Awards & Points Chairperson forty-five (45) days prior to the Awards Banquet, or by December 1st of the year received, for engraving the following year's recipients. The return of these trophies will be the complete responsibility of the recipients.

Rules for World Show Youth Team Tournament

1. You must turn in a letter of intent, signed by you and your parents to the youth advisors by the end of the youth show in April.
2. You must turn in the following by the end of the P-O-R show the following weekend: List of classes in order of preference in which you would like to participate; Your placings in those classes at as many OPHC shows as there are up to APHA deadline; A copy of your horses registration papers; Your name and APHA Youth number.
3. Youth advisor will determine who will show in what classes according to the most points earned in as many OPHC shows as there are up to the APHA deadline.
4. You must be a member of OPHC.
5. A time will be designated by which you must check in with a designated person at the World Show. If you have not, someone else will be substituted in your classes.
6. OPHYC will pay the entry. Other financial help will be discussed after our Youth Show.

Classes included in the Team Tournament are Showmanship, Leadline, Walk-Trot, Hunter Under Saddle, Horsemanship, Western Pleasure, Reining and Barrels.

Rules for World Show Youth Judging Team

1. You must turn in a letter of intent, signed by you and your parents to the youth advisors by the end of the youth show in April.
2. Youth advisor will make any decisions, if needed, about who can participate according to experience.
3. OPHYC will pay entry fees for a maximum of two teams. Each team consists of 4 members and an alternate. Any other financial support will be decided after the youth show.
4. You must be a member of OPHC.

If you make a commitment to do one of these activities, please do everything you can to participate. These entries must be made by May 15 and cannot be changed or substituted.

Participation would include showing a horse or participating in any OPHC activity in the current year. Participation could also include assisting at a show, helping with food drives or trail ride, etc.. You must obtain a letter from the activity Chairperson describing your involvement in the activity.
3. Be a high school senior or active college undergraduate student enrolled in a two or four year college or a trade school as a full time student.

Please include in your application a short answer response to the following questions. Responses should be complete sentences, using correct grammar and very descriptive. Length of responses should be that which accurately and completely answers the question. Feel free to include photographs, news clippings, or other images that would be helpful in your descriptions.

1. Describe your passed and/or present involvement in high school activities – (ie. sports, clubs student government, etc..)
2. Describe your past and present involvement in your community – (i.e. 4-H, community service groups, area chamber of commerce, etc..)
3. Describe your involvement in the Ohio Paint Horse Youth Club. Include time spent showing horses, serving on committees, offices held, activities involved in at the club level, fund raising activities, and community service involvement. OPHC AMATEUR AWARDS SYSTEM

- 1 The system of points shall be the same as the Ohio Paint Horse Club.
- 2 To qualify for Year End Awards in the State of Ohio, a horse must be owned by the amateur, the amateur's family, spouse, mother, father, son, daughter, brother, sister, grandchild, legal ward, in-laws (father, mother, brother or sister) or family owned corporation, ranch or farm. APHA AMATEUR RULE
- 3 Points will be compiled on a one rider/one horse combination.
- 4 Points will count for any approved OPHC show offering amateur classes.
- 5 Five (5) awards will be presented to the top five high point amateurs showing regular registry horses. All points will be combined from all amateur classes into one total, with the amateur having the largest total being first, next largest total second, etc. for a one horse/one rider combination. Three (3) awards will be presented to the top three high point novice amateurs (one horse/one rider combination) showing regular registry horses following the same format above. Only novice classes will be totaled for the top three (3) novice awards. Two (2) awards will be presented to the top two overall high point amateurs showing solid paint bred registered horses. **Two (2) awards will be presented to the top two overall high point amateur walk-trot exhibitors.**
- 6 To be eligible for OPHC Amateur Year End Awards, the horse and rider combination must show under ten (10) judges at OPHC approved shows, of which four (4) judges must be at non-Paint-O-Rama shows, and of which one (1) of those shows must be held in the boundaries of Ohio.
- 7 There will be a High Point Amateur Western Pleasure Rotating Trophy. This is the **Jennifer A. Fedorek Memorial Trophy**. There will also be a **Ron Fille Memorial Trophy** will be awarded to the Overall High Point Amateur. Rules for winning these trophies are: This trophy will be awarded to the high point amateur western pleasure team and the overall high point amateur at the end of each show year. The trophy will be awarded at the annual awards banquet for the Ohio Paint Horse Club.
 - A. To be eligible for this award, the amateur must be in good standing and hold an amateur card from the APHA. The horse must be owned by the amateur or other parties as outlined in the APHA rule book. The award will be presented only to a team consisting of one rider/one horse.
 - B. The amateur rider/horse team must have exhibited as a team under at least ten (10) OPHC approved amateur western pleasure judges. Paint-O-Ramas, as always, will count as separate shows per judge (refer to the OPHC awards system rules).
 - C. Ties will be broken, since this is a single revolving trophy. These methods will be used to break ties: 1-The team with the most firsts, 2-The team with the most seconds, 3-A flip of the coin with all parties present.
 - D. The trophy must be returned to the OPHC Awards Chair at least forty-five (45) days prior to the year end awards banquet, or by December 1st of the year received. The return of the trophy will be the complete responsibility of the recipient. This time will allow for sufficient time for engraving for the new winner's name and to allow time for engraving a plaque, which will be presented to the previous year's winner, prior to the presenting of the trophy to the current year's winner.
 - E. The maintenance of the trophy, engraving of each year's winner, and the cost and engraving of the plaque presented to the prior year's winner will be paid by an escrow account set up by and managed through the custodian. However, damage to the trophy due to neglect or abuse on the part of the recipient should be borne by the recipient, and failure to do so will result in the barring of that amateur from eligibility of the high point trophy in future years. Although the trophy is maintained by a separate custodian, as long as the award shall be given, the authority to make any changes, additions or amendments to these guidelines shall be given to the OPHC, Amateur Division, through a majority vote.
 - F. These memorial trophies are for the highest point earning regular registry one amateur rider/one horse combination in Amateur Western Pleasure class and the High Point Western Pleasure and the Amateur and Overall High Point Amateur.
- 8 A Sportsmanship Award will be presented for the current year and will be voted on at the General Membership Meeting of that year.
- 9 The Ohio Paint Horse Amateur Club will award the #1 Amateur with a rotating trophy. This trophy will be awarded annually at the year-end awards banquet to the highest point earning one rider/one horse combination in the Amateur division. The trophy must be returned to the OPHC Awards Chair at least forty-five (45) days prior the year end awards banquet, or by December 1st of the year received. The return of the trophy will be the complete responsibility of the recipient. The **Ron Fille Memorial Trophy** will be awarded to the Overall High Point Amateur.
- 10 A Gist Award certificate will be awarded for the #1 Amateur and the #1 Novice Amateur providing there are sufficient funds. In any conflict between the constitution of the Club and the Rules & By-Laws of the APHA, those of APHA will govern.

O.P.H.C. STALLION SERVICE AUCTION (SSA)

Amended and restated November 6, 2016

Section 1.00 - AUCTION TERMS & CONDITIONS

- 1.01 **Live bidding to begin at the yearly banquet (date to be determined). If you are unable to attend, mail in or phone bidding will be accepted.** Bidding will start at one-half (1/2) the stud fee or \$250.00, whichever is greater. Stud fee must be the usual, advertised fee. If advertised at private treaty, stallion owner retains the right to stipulate the starting bid, which shall be treated for the purpose of this auction as 50% of the stallion fee.
- 1.02 All bids must be paid in full the day of the sale unless other arrangements have been made with auction chairperson prior to sale.
- 1.03 Service must be used in the year donated and purchased.
- 1.04 Mares are not to be bred prior to payment of bid in full. Stallion owners will be notified of purchaser's name, address and telephone number by the Stallion Service Auction (SSA) Chairperson. If an "insufficient funds" check is received, the mare will not be bred until the purchase amount is made good within 15 days of NSF notice. If check is not made good, the purchase will be considered null and void and the stallion service put on the list of remaining, available services.
- 1.05 **Mare owners may purchase stallion services that have not been sold for 60% of the advertised/stated stud fee (40% off)** until June 1 of the current year of the auction.
- 1.06 All funds collected from the stallion services sold and stay fees shall be held in trust and will be added to the purse by the Ohio Paint Horse Club (OPHC) until such time as the required distributions under the SSA Rules herein. The funds shall be allocated as follows: 10% to OPHC, 30% to Weanling SSA Futurities, 30% to Yearling SSA Futurities, and 30% to SSA Two Year Old Futurities
- 1.07 Mares must be broke to halter and lead and be in sound breeding condition. All monies for mare care, chute fees, and veterinary (if needed) are to be collected by and paid to the stallion owner. Donating stallion owners shall indicate on their donation forms the amount of the mare care, chute fees or other charges to be paid for by the mare owner. The OPHC shall not be responsible for disputes between the Stallion Owner and Mare Owner.
- 1.08 The stallion service auction breeding contract shall be the only binding contract pertaining to this breeding. Both the Stallion and Mare Owner agree to abide by the terms set forth in the contract.
- 1.09 Stallion owner agrees to diligently try to settle mare, administer proper care of mare if at their facility, and guarantee a breeders certificate for APHA papers (regular or solid paint bred) for live foals born. A copy of stallion's papers must accompany their SSA contract.
- 1.10 **OPHC shall not be responsible or assume liability in the case of accident, injury or illness to stallion or mare at any time.**
- 1.11 **No stallion service consignments will be accepted after the beginning date of the sale.**
- 1.12 There shall be NO REFUNDS under any circumstances.
- 1.13 Any mare owner purchasing a service must be a current member of the OPHC.
- 1.14 In the case of death of the stallion or should stallion become unfit for breeding purposes prior to fulfilling the SSA service (by written veterinary statement), mare owner may apply payment toward a remaining unsold service in the current year, apply payment toward the purchase of a service the following year, or forfeit purchase. No refunds will be given.
- 1.15 The OPHC Board reserves the right to interpret, amend and enforce all rules. Any decision or interpretation made by the Board shall be final.
- 1.16 Stallion services may not be resold.

O.P.H.C. STALLION SERVICE (SSA) FUTURITY

- 2.01 In order for a foal to be eligible for the SSA Futurities, it must be an offspring of the stallion sold in this auction.
- 2.02 In order for the foal to be eligible the sire or dam must be registered with the APHA, APSHA or the APQHA. All foals must be registered with the APHA. Solid paint bred are eligible for all SSA classes.
- 2.03 There shall be a maximum of a one year carry-over of eligibility if a stallion owner guarantees a live foal and the mare bred does not produce a foal in the year following the purchase of the stallion service. The mare owner shall be responsible for notifying the SSA Chairperson in writing, postmarked no later than August 5th of the year following the purchase of stallion service that the mare owner elects to carry-over eligibility under this section.
- 2.04 In order for a foal to be eligible, the owner(s) must be a member(s) of OPHC in good standing.
- 2.05 Stallion owner is limited to providing one service per stallion sold. The sale of the stallion service makes the stallion owner and the purchaser eligible to show one (1) foal each in the futurity out of a mare he/she owns or leases. A leased mare is defined as one with an APHA lease form filed before the breeding of the mare. Those owners whose stallions do not sell have the option to purchase their stallion's service at 50% of the stud fee by June 1st for two free foal entries (as owner and purchaser). A stallion owner may carry over eligibility for one year if the stallion owner's mare does not produce a foal in the year of eligibility.
- 2.06 One free entry fee will be given to the purchaser of the service and the stallion owner and can be used as a weanling, yearling or two-year-old class. Must notify SSA Futurity Chair which class the one-time free entry fee will be used. *If the free entry is not used in the weanling year, that foal must still be designated/nominated by December 31st of the foaling year.*
- 2.07 The Weanling Division will be shown in 2 divisions – Colts and Fillies. If there are 7 or more entries entered in a division, the

- class will be separated into Junior and Senior. Junior and Senior classes will be split based on the median birthdate of all entries. When an odd number of foals are entered, the junior class shall be the larger.
- 2.08 The weanling entry for the futurity must be nominated to the SSA Futurity Chairperson postmarked no later than August 5th of the eligible weanling year. This rule applies to both the mare owner who purchased the stallion service as well as the stallion owner's entry. *A late penalty of \$100 paid to the OPHC may be made until 24 hours prior to the class in addition to the above entry fee. The late penalty shall be added to the purse.* All entries must have papers in hand to show.
- 2.09 **Entry fees for each class will be \$100 and open to all offspring of the stallion sold beginning with the following year after the sale.**
- 2.10 The Yearling Division will be shown in 4 classes - Halter Fillies, Colts, Geldings, and Lunge Line. **Yearlings by the eligible stallions designated can be shown with a one time entry fee of \$100 per class entered (Halter \$100, Lunge Line \$100).** Yearling Lunge Line Class shall be run according to APHA rules in effect at the time of the show. A copy of registration papers must accompany this fee. Payment is due postmarked by August 5th of the year of the show to the SSA Futurity Chairperson. A late penalty of \$100 paid to the OPHC may be made until 24 hours prior to the class in addition to the above entry fee. The late penalty shall be added to the purse.
- 2.11 Owner is responsible to be sure all payments are made on time. The OPHC, its officers, directors, and chairpersons will not be held responsible for any missed payments and unpaid memberships.
- 2.12 Changes in ownership do not change eligibility of foal, provided new owner is a member of the OPHC by the show date. Notify chairperson of any changes in ownership.
- 2.13 The following is a division of the purses (the same sliding scale as the OPHC Futurity):

- The purse is divided by the total number of foals/horses exhibited per age division (amount per foal/horse) and is then multiplied by the number of foals/horses in each class to determine the amount to be distributed in each class.
- 2.14 Ten percent (10%) of the total purse collected from the auction, as well as any interest accrued on any accounts, as well as late fees, shall be paid to the OPHC to subsidize trophies, auction, advertising and show expenses, etc. at a time designated by the Board of Directors.
- 2.15 Thirty percent (30%) of the total purse collected from the SSA will be placed in the Weanling Halter Futurity split between the junior and senior colts and fillies (4 classes) as described in § 2.13.
- 2.16 Thirty percent (30%) of the total purse will be placed in the Yearling SSA Futurity split between Halter Colts, Halter Fillies, Halter Geldings and Yearling Lunge Line classes (§ 2.13).

Section 3.00 - 2 YR OLD WESTERN PLEASURE & HUNTER UNDER SADDLE

- 3.01 The OPHC SSA Snaffle Bit Futurity shall consist of Western Pleasure & Hunter Under Saddle classes.
- 3.02 Thirty percent (30%) of the total purse will be placed in the Snaffle Bit Futurity, split between Western and English classes using the procedure in § 2.13.
- 3.03 Foals eligible and nominated in the previous Yearling SSA Halter division may show in one or both current year Snaffle Bit classes. Solid paint bred are eligible.
- 3.04 **All offspring out of the eligible stallions designated can be shown.**
- 3.05 Proof of eligibility to be made with a copy of registration papers. They will be checked with a list of foals declared by stallion owners and mare owners. Copy of registration papers must accompany entry.
- 3.06 A onetime entry fee of \$100 per class paid in one payment. Payment is due postmarked by August 5th of the year of the show to the SSA Futurity Chairperson. *A late penalty of \$100, paid to OPHC may be made until 24 hours prior to the class in addition to the above stated entry fee. The late penalty shall be added to the purse.*
- 3.07 It is the responsibility of the owners of horses entered in the SSA Futurity to be sure payments are made in full and on time. The OPHC, its officers, directors and chairpersons will not be responsible for any missed payments and unpaid memberships.
- 3.08 Transfer of ownership does not change eligibility. Futurity Chairperson must be notified of transfer. All owners must be members of OPHC.
- 3.09 Classes shall run according to APHA 2 year old Western Pleasure and Hunter Under Saddle class rules in effect at the time of the show, and entries may be subject to drug testing.

O.P.H.C. RECREATIONAL RIDING PROGRAM

This program is designated to promote members and their Regular Registry and Solid Paint Bred Paint Horses, who ride or drive for recreation and leisure purposes by providing and promoting trail rides in the State of Ohio.

1. All ride participants and their vehicles must be registered by completing the **APHA** Trail Ride contract with a signed liability release waiver.
2. Chairpersons, Co-Chairpersons, Management/Grounds Owners, where you are riding, and the Ohio Paint Horse Club, reserve the right to qualify each rider's ability and to excuse any rider from activities beyond their skill level for safety purposes.
3. All riders under 18 must be accompanied by a parent, legal guardian or chaperone in camp and on the ride. No minors may be left in camp unattended. Location will determine rider's minimum age.
4. Alcoholic beverages are not allowed on the trail.
5. A Trail Boss or Pace Setter will be assigned, all riders must stay behind the trail boss or pace setter.
6. No rough riding or racing is permitted.
7. Stallions are not permitted.
8. Dogs and other pets are not permitted on the trail. In camp, pets must be contained or on a leash at all times.
9. No riding double.
10. No motorized vehicles (ATV's, motorbikes, scooters, golf carts) or bicycles allowed on the trail.
11. Riders must be able to ride without the assistance of others.
12. To warn other riders, a horse prone to kicking must have a red ribbon tied at the top of its tail.
13. In accordance with the Ohio State Department of Agriculture, no out of state horse will be allowed on the premises without the following:
 - A. Health Certificate issued no earlier than 10 days by a licensed veterinarian from the horse's state of origin.
 - B. Negative Coggins (test for Equine Infectious Anemia) - Dated no earlier than 6 months. Ask your veterinarian for the required health documentation for your horse to travel to Ohio from your state.
 - C. Only healthy horses will be allowed on premises.
14. No smoking while riding on the trail. Smoking allowed in designated areas only.
15. No ponied or loose horses allowed on ride except as approved by Management.
16. No firearms.
17. No fireworks.
18. In case of emergency, immediately contact the Chairperson, Co-Chairpersons, Trail Boss or Pace Setter.
19. The rules for the grounds that has been contracted with (i.e.: Metropolitan, State of Ohio, US National Parks, etc.) will also be in effect. If they are different than our rules, written notification will be given to you at the time you sign the OPHC Trail Ride Agreement and the liability release waiver.
20. The Ohio Paint Horse Club, Inc., its Officers and Directors or the contracted grounds will not be responsible for loss, injury, damage to property or theft of any kind.

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Ride Ohio Rules and Requirements

1. To enroll in Ride Ohio, you must be a member of the Ohio Paint Horse Club. Then you must pre-register with the OPHC Ride Ohio Chairperson. You must maintain your membership in OPHC while achieving hours under the program.
2. You must ride or drive in a cart on a Registered American Paint Horse Association (APHA) horse which may be either Breeding Stock or Regular Registry. You do not have to own the Paint Horse.
3. You may ride more than one American Paint Horse, but you must attain a separate time log. You may accumulate hours in the Ride Ohio program at the same time you accumulate hours in APHA's PAC Recreational Riding program.
4. You must keep an accurate record of the time (one hour for each hour actually spent riding or driving a cart) in your official Ride Ohio time log. All time logged is a one horse-one rider basis and on the honor system. Your hours may carry over into subsequent years as long as you are an OPHC member.
5. The Ride Ohio program offers bonus hours to members who log time in a metropolitan, state or national trail (as recognized by a city, the State of Ohio, or U.S. National Parks) For every hour you spend riding in a Metropolitan, State, or National Park, you may earn double hours. In other words, if you spend one hour riding or driving a cart in any of the above parks, you may log two hours for your time. Please state the park on your log
6. You may record time for an activity you participate in like riding, driving a cart, leisure riding, or parade group.
7. OPHC will recognize your riding or driving achievements at 100, 500, 1000, and each 500 hours after those awards are earned. You will be recognized at the annual Awards Banquet and in the newsletter
